To perform it, HCO and Music Director Robin Browning are delighted to welcome Sara Deborah Timossi, who lives near Petersfield with her family and performs widely as a chamber musician and baroque specialist as well as being the founder of the annual “Spirit of Music Festival”.

We combine the Vaughan-Williams with Beethoven as Sara Deborah also plays the Romance in F, and the orchestra will end the concert with the great master’s Symphony No. 4.

Opening the concert, the string section of the orchestra will go it alone for the Serenade by Dag Wirén – those of a certain age should listen out for a famous TV theme of yesteryear!

To Arrive at Ferneham Hall ... (See **www.fernehamhall.co.uk** for more details)
From M27 Junction 11 follow signs for Fareham “Town Centre” then for “Shopping Centre multi-storey (N) car park” which is in Osborn Road, adjacent to the hall (free after 6pm). The Train Station is 10 to 15 minutes’ walk or a short taxi ride. The Bus Station is closer.
