One of the most popular violin concertos is that by Johannes Brahms and we’re delighted to welcome violinist Charlotte Saluste-Bridoux to play this with us. French-born Charlotte has been a student of the Yehudi Menuhin School and the Royal College of Music and is definitely a rising young star!

Beginning the concert will be the dramatic Overture “Egmont” by Beethoven and to conclude we perform the evocative, joyful and melodious “Scottish” Symphony by Mendelssohn. Both composers were inspired by landscapes and by Scotland and Mendelssohn was particularly good at portraying the romantic European sensitivity for the bleak but enticing atmosphere of the Highlands.
